The City of Horace is requesting a letter of support for the Cass County Road 17 Shared Use Path Phase 4 and Phase 5 grant request.


This letter of support is for the FY 2024 – 2025 Transportation Alternative Grant Application for a Federal Aid project of constructing a shared use path along the east side of Cass Road 17 from 81st Ave S to 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave N and the west side of County Road 17 from 68th Ave S to 64th Ave S. These projects will tie into similar shared use projects have been completed or are scheduled from 88th Ave S to 68th Ave S.

This project will be completed within the Cass County road right of way. However, the construction will be the responsibility of the City of Horace and the project funding will be an 80:20 cost share with federal funding and the City of Horace responsible for the local cost share. Cass County has no financial obligation for this project.

Dear Commissioners,

Cass County Emergency Management would like to inform you of important information regarding the Cass County Multi Hazard Mitigation Plan (MHMP). FEMA regulations for local and tribal governments require that MHMP's be updated and resubmitted to FEMA for approval every five years.

As you are aware, local governments and tribes acting as sub grantees must have a FEMA approved MHMP in order to apply for and/or receive project grants under the following hazard mitigation assistance programs:

- Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)
- · Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)
- Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA)

Project grants obligated under any of these programs prior to the expiration of a FEMA approved mitigation plan are not affected by this policy, and will continue to be administered under the terms of the grant award. To maintain eligibility for these grants, regulations require that a local government and tribe acting as sub grantee must have an approved MHMP at the time it receives the grants. Therefore, if any MHMP's lapse (i.e., expires before the new or updated plan is approved by FEMA), those jurisdictions will not be eligible for, and FEMA will not award, grant funds for projects under any of the above programs during the lapse. The fact that the local government or tribe had a FEMA approved MHMP when a declaration occurred, or when a PDM or FMA grant application was submitted, is not sufficient to receive funds after the plan has expired.

The Cass County Multi Hazard Mitigation Plan expires on October 6, 2024 and we will begin our update process soon. This signed letter serves as your jurisdictions letter of intent to participate in the Hazard Mitigation Plan update by having at least one person be the voice of Cass County, either by attending meetings and/or collaborating through electronic communications.
