








Flood Forecast – Sheyenne River Bald Hill Dam












High Water Point: 2009 – 91.7' 2011 – 91.8' 2019 – 91.3' 2022 – 89.9'

Cass County Flood Strategy

No Change based on current NWS Forecast

- Red River: temporary levees build to 38' plus freeboard if predicted crest indicates a flood over 36'
- ♦ Sheyenne River:
 - ♦ Harwood gage planning for of 91.5'-92.0'
 - ♦ Kindred 20.5'-21.2'
- ♦ Maple River: south of Mapleton 22.4'-23.2'.
- ♦ Rush River: expect near record flooding
- Overland Flooding: Prepare for unusual conditions as Ditches & Culverts packed with snow

 Sandbag operations start on April 11th Click here to request sandbag Sandbag Costs and Sand Distribution: Sandbags are only sold in bundles of 1,000 for \$100, which includes sand delivery. Bundles will not be broken up into smaller quantities. Residents will need to pick up the sandbag bundles at the Cass County Highway Department; 10 cubic yards of sand will be delivered (this will fill 1,000 bags). If residents have bags from previous years, then they may order sand at no charge. A new form is required for each order even if a resident has previously ordered sand/bags. All requests must be made through the link above. 						

Sandbag Deployment

 Filled Sandbags: Prioritize delivering filled sandbags

- Homes impacted by our levee construction will get 2000-3000.
- For homes in rural subdivisions and rural residents, we will try to deliver 1000 bags per home (based on flood needs and sandbag availability).

- Empty Sandbag Distribution
 - 19,000 empty sandbags/loads of sand
- Filled Sandbag Delivery

 - $\otimes 4/17/23$ 8000 filled sandbags scheduled

Over the weekend 2000 sandbags went out on emergency runs near Davenport and Grandin


Rapid Deployable Flood Barriers



We plan to deploy temporary levee construction on Chrisan Blvd and 76th Ave/Forrest River Road if the Red River will crest above 35 feet.

- Install Culvert Closures around 4/24/2023
- Install Trapbags around 4/24/2023
