| Subject: | Mid-Year Attorney FTE Position Request |

Members of the Cass County Commission:

I am requesting a mid-year budget adjustment to add a Senior Assistant State's Attorney to my staff. This position is classified as D62A. Below is the cost estimate provided by the finance office:

- Senior Attorney D62A Step 1--\$154,285
- Justification—adequate staffing to perform core office duties while meeting attorney ethical obligations and supporting a healthy working environment.
 - Caseloads in Cass County remain high. We handle approximately 26 regularly scheduled court sessions per week. That number will increase when the new courtroom is completed.
 - Technology continues to advance. The vast majority of local law enforcement agencies are now fully equipped with body and squad car cameras. Downloading information from cell phones is now common-place in criminal investigations. These advances have created significantly larger amounts of data and evidence to review than we have experienced in the past.
 - o Cass County's population continues to increase, and with it so do crime rates.
 - Cass County has seen a significant increase in jury trials in 2025. This year my office has tried 11 jury trials—more than were tried in all of 2024. Causes include increased case filings, less experienced defense and prosecution attorneys, and defendants with increasing mental health needs and substance use disorders.
 - National consultants identified a disproportionate workload on the personal crimes teams. Since that time, my office has taken many steps to redistribute work. Redistribution has not been able to solve what many attorneys in my office have described as "unsustainable" workloads.
 - Performance appraisal feedback from attorneys has indicated they feel overwhelmed and unable to maintain a healthy work life balance or take annual leave.
 - A Veterans Treatment Court (VTC) will be starting in Cass County. The Commission indicated it supported creation of the VTC but would not be providing financial support. However, the VTC will require representation from my office.
 - Manpower projection for 2026 included the addition of another FTE attorney for 2026.
 - A review of other regional prosecutors' offices found that Cass County's number of citizens per attorney is significantly higher than comparison offices.

<u>SUGGESTED MOTION</u>: Authorize an additional Attorney FTE position for the Cass County State's Attorney's Office.
